



Elements of Trust: Tell the truth and let me choose – I might trust you


- Communication tell
- Truthful information the truth
- Autonomy *let me*
- Alternatives choose
- No guarantee *I might*

Role of Physician in the Trust Relationship between the Patient and the Healthcare System

- Doctors have seemingly the greatest influence on trust of patients
- Doctors are a **nexus point** between the healthcare system and the patient (System Representative)
- Doctors directly involved in a person's care, transparent with patients, received their consent, and communicated well with them had high levels of trust from the public
- Preliminary results from focus groups on public trust supports this








Collaboration
